The FRIENDS OF GILLESPIE COUNTY COUNTRY SCHOOLS DRIVING & DISTANCE CHART was designed to assist visitors, locals, and those serving visitors in planning a country drive to view some of our 12 member-historic-country schools. The chart compliments The Friends of Gillespie County Country Schools Driving Trail Brochure. Nearest school to Fredericksburg is Wrede at 3.8 miles with a drive time of 7 minutes based upon Map Quest Online. Most distant school is Williams Creek School at 20.7 miles and a drive time of 25 minutes. Our goal is to assist our members, residents, local employees and volunteers around town in answering customers' questions. 

Willow City was the first school in the county to have a bus. Dudley Althaus started school in 1939and rode the new bus, a 1939 GMC that the Willow City School District purchased. It had bench seats on the sides and two-person seats in the middle. The bus transported pupils from smaller consolidated schools, like Big Flat to Willow City School. Shown are students who rode the bus and their driver, Ernest Schilling.
